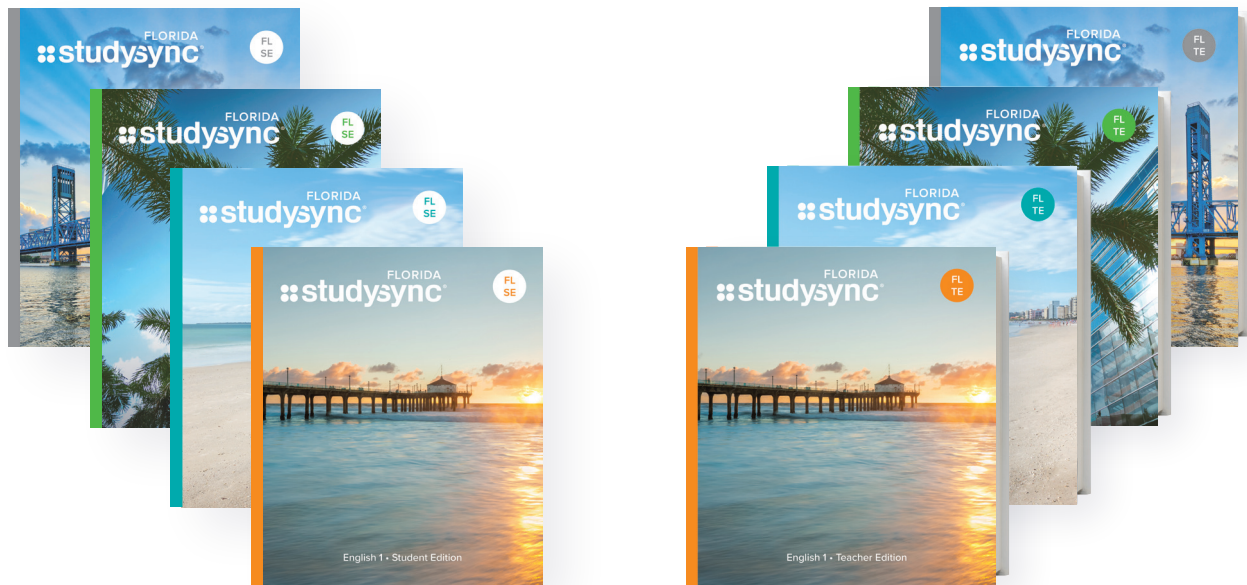

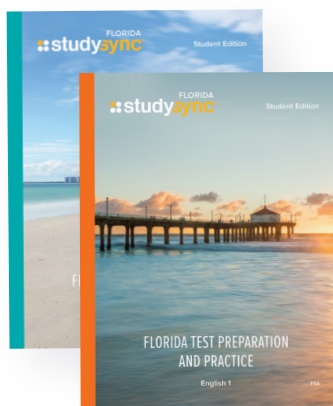

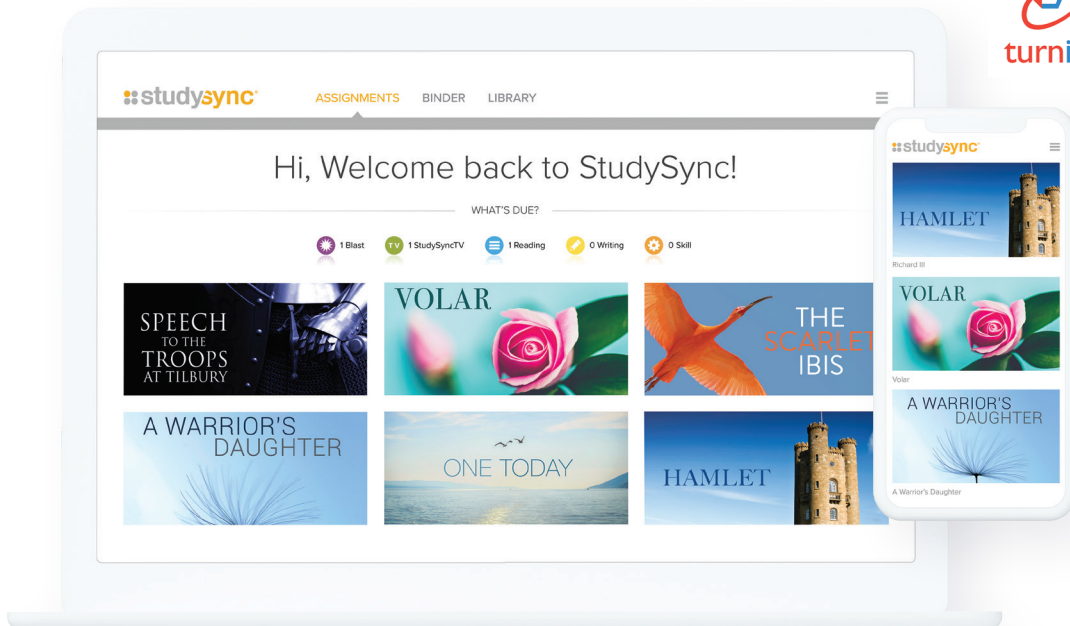

- **Close Reading**

StudySync Core ELA units support close reading through a consistent reading routine of First Read lessons, skill lessons, and Close Read lessons. In this routine, students construct the meaning of complex texts while they learn and apply standards-based reading skills.
- **Knowledge-Building**

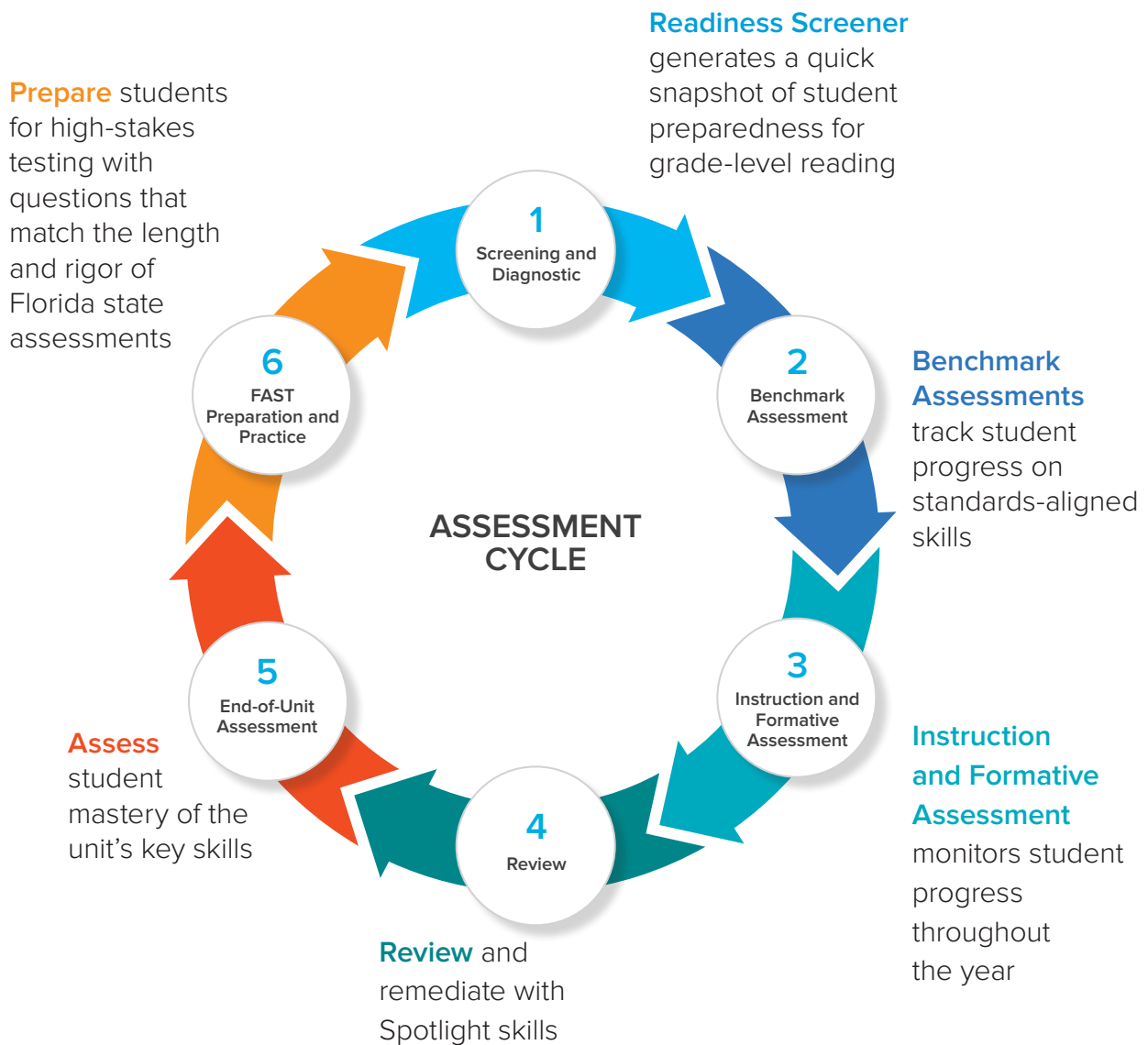

Lesson Organization

Every lesson features multiple opportunities for whole group, small group, and independent learning.

Collaborative and Peer Group Learning

Students consistently engage in frequent peer group learning in all StudySync lessons. Look for this symbol in the Pacing Guide that identifies texts with special media resources modeling collaborative conversation strategies for students.

Knowledge and Vocabulary

Knowledge leads to understanding. Vocabulary is key to building knowledge. Students work with academic and content vocabulary across lessons so they can use the terms to discuss about the unit texts, while Knowledge-Building Basics and activities provide information needed to access the texts.

Skills Instruction

Texts may include skills instruction around more than one skill. These skills are purposefully combined to support student analysis of the text. Every close read lesson requires students to draw on multiple skills to support their analysis, either with stacked skill instruction or spiraled skills from prior texts and units.

Embedded P. Assessment

Checks for understanding provide teaching steps and in-class adjustments will struggle. Two of each unit support standards coverage instruction with items.

Table of Contents

Every StudySync unit can be taught two ways, both of which ensure full standards coverage. Pacing guides for each option are on the pages that follow.

A Core ELA Option

Each Core ELA Unit provides 30 days of integrated reading and writing instruction with a series of short texts connected to a common theme.

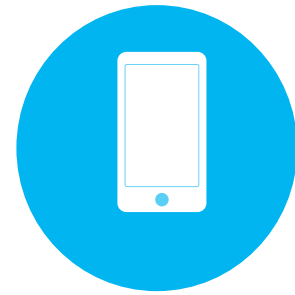

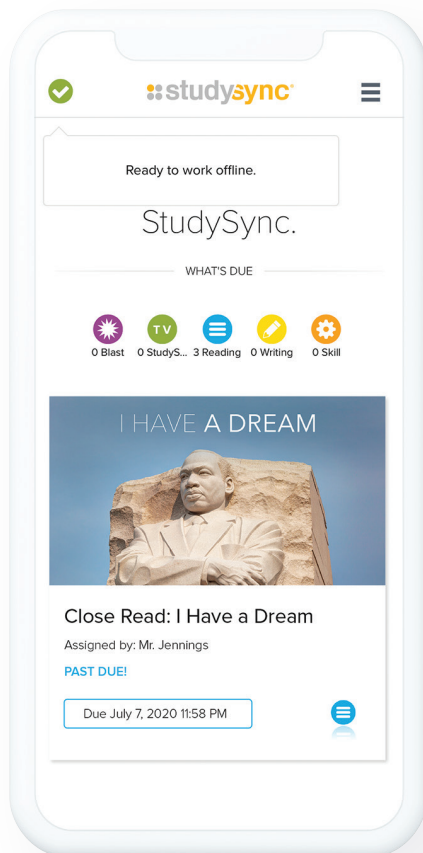

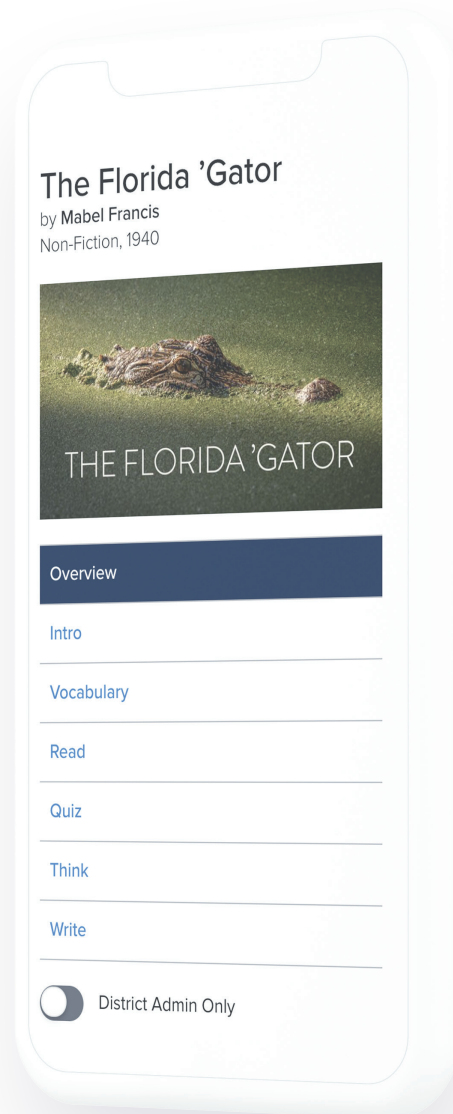
